Transparency

How would you define transparency for student's?

Transparency in higher education looks to provide students with knowledge and understanding of every step they need to take to reach graduation.

- Clear expectations of goals, policies, degree milestones, progress
- Students understanding their next steps, how to proactively plan for their program
- Who to go to for what? Program Coordinator vs Faculty vs Graduate Studies
- Where to seek resources and help mental health, food security etc. What do they have access to as a grad student on campus?

Why does Transparency matter?

- Transparency is a necessary part of holistic advising.
- Holistic Advising students have all the information they need to make academic and personal decisions regarding their education
- Grad Studies: outlining the process for filing their thesis dissertation in detail on the graduate studies website.
- Coordinator: eliminating confusion around unique department practices. Not relying on assumptions that others will share critical information. Accessibility

High level issues with lack of transparency?

- Transactional advising not a holistic approach
- Equity
- Reactive vs proactive advising
- Alienating students in a program or department
- Disproportionate experiences program to program
- Heavy reliance on student mentor relationships.
